ARC EoE Fellowship Programme

How it works:

- Funding for 1 day a week for a year to a maximum of £12,500 (via backfill)
- Carrying out a project under supervision of an ARC senior researcher
- Attend teaching workshops & action learning sets

Main aims:

- Making sense of the research world
- Promoting the use of research-based evidence in healthcare and social care organisations

Who are the fellowships for:

The ARC Fellowship is aimed at clinicians, health & social care practitioners, voluntary sector staff and NHS managers across the East of England. It is for those who would like to work at the interface of research and practice; develop an understanding of the research environment; and develop skills in research methodology, service redesign, change management and implementing evidence-based improvements into practice.

Two fellowship opportunities:

ARC Research Fellowship

The research fellowship is aimed at people working in the voluntary sector and health and social care professionals who are keen to develop an understanding of the research environment, and to develop skills in research methodology, service redesign and change management.

ARC Implementation Fellowship

A central part of the strategy is the ARC Implementation Fellowship, which is a tailored programme for health and social care staff interested in implementation. This fellowship emphasises the importance of relationships between people, teams and organisations when implementing research.

How to apply

Identify area of interest & contact relevant theme lead as early as possible

Discuss with Theme Lead if the project is **suitable** for a fellowship

Identify a supervisor and write proposal ready for applying (support is available for this)

Access the application form and guidance on our website

Submit your application by 30th November 2022

If shortlisted, **attend an interview**January 2023
